

Section 3: Camp Rules and Code of Conduct

Cancelledations

Cancelledations will be refunded in full if made two weeks prior to the scheduled start of camp. Otherwise only 50% refund will be given for cancellation made prior to the camp. No refunds will be given to no-shows.

No Prorated Fees

All attendees will be required to pay the full registration fee. We cannot give credit for missed nights, skipped meals, or similar.

Reserved Right

During the camp, rude or unruly participants may be disciplined by contacting parents or church leaders and/or subject to expulsion from camp at the discretion of the camp leadership.

Conduct

All participants agree to conduct themselves in the highest character, both morally and ethically during the camp. Their actions, communications, and dress should exemplify humility, meekness, and righteous living. Their demeanor should be exemplified through mercy, kindness, gentleness, and compassion. Participants agree that they are no better than their congregants, fellow campers, or camp staff.

Dress Code

Bring clothes which provide a good witness of Jesus Christ. Clothes should be modest and not revealing. Consult pastor for suggestions.

Authorization for use of photograph or likeness

Location

Camp Shawnee is a group camping area located at Knob Noster State Park in Knob Noster, Missouri. Knob Noster State Park is approximately 75 miles east of downtown Kansas City, Missouri. The park's 3,934 acres are forested and it is an excellent setting for renewal and meditation on our personal relationship with God.

Facilities

Camp Shawnee is a semi-rustic group camping area with cabins arranged in a dormitory style setting. There is no air-conditioning in the cabins. The male campers will be separated from female campers. Beds are located in the dorms which accommodate single gender residency. Bathrooms are a short distance from the cabins. Attendees will be required to bring their own pillow, sleeping bag or sheets and blankets. **Bring camp chairs.**

Directions

Take I-70 east or take Hwy 50 east to MO-13 toward Warrensburg. Continue south on 13 through Warrensburg to Hwy DD. Turn east on DD, continue to Knob Noster State Park. As soon as you enter the state park, you will see a sign for Camp Shawnee, turn left (north) into the camp and follow the road to the dining hall parking lot.

Attire (Clothing)

Attire for the week is casual and comfortable. The weather may be hot during the day and cool at night. Be prepared for rain. Bring shoes that work well in wet or dry weather. Do not bring clothes which advertise drugs, cigarettes, or unchristian-like behavior. Consult parents, pastor, or church leader for suggestions on appropriate clothing. Bring swim suit.

Do not Bring

Cell phone, iPods, or other electronic devices that distract from the camp purposes to retreat from the world. Do not bring cigarettes, alcohol, fireworks, drugs, or any other substance which is against laws for Missouri parks. Do not bring food, candy, or sodas because wild animals (raccoons, mice, etc.) will enter your cabin or suitcase to find it.

\$125.00 per camper includes food, t-shirt and facilities. Please pay the amount at least 2 weeks prior to camp. Late registration fee of \$25 per person will be charged for payments received less than 2 weeks prior to camp.
